#### Minutes of the committee meeting held via ZOOM on Tuesday 6th December 2022

PRESENT: B. Hutchings, M. Jones, C. Warren, J. Goodsell, M. Grinyer, J. Matheson, N. Derbyshire, M. Knight, S. Gibson, M. Smith

**CORRESPONDENCE:** email from Club in response to an enquiry regarding Committee Badges. Bob has been in touch with a company they suggested. This will be dealt with in the New Year. Also had confirmation that the price of the feather flags. This can be discussed after new year.

**REPORTS: CHAIRMAN**: Bob has been receiving replies to the New Year Update letter and most attendees have paid. **VICE-CHAIRMAN**: ESCC 54. Visitor's 25. Total 75. Average 19.75%. **SECRETARY**: Nominal 1642. This has dropped by about 2000 members. **TREASURER**: There is £10,641.04 in the current account. Yoyh account £415.20. **RALLY SECRETARY**: still chasing a couple of T&Cs, Bob has spoken to both contacts, and both said they'll get them sent through. **YOUTH**: Jez has sent the vouchers and had a good response with many of the children sending photos of their purchases. Sue J has purchased and wrapped all of the selection boxes for the party. He asked MJ to pass on his thanks. Preparations are all in place for the Party. Jan has the £5 ready to reimburse parents/guardians.

**SOUTHERN CENTRES**: Email with ideas for dog show, cake stall etc. Requested for people to help too. Only 100 booked in at present, a third of the normal. Jez will push on Facebook.

**SOUTH EAST REGION:** Malcolm & Bob attended a Zoom meeting last Wednesday. Items discussed were dates for the next year's meetings, the venue for Question Time – still being investigated. Confirmation of West Sussex hosting the 2023 SER AGM at Steyning School over the weekend 20<sup>th</sup> -22<sup>nd</sup> October. Also mentioned was the extended Clean Air zone in London, this comes into effect on the 29<sup>th</sup> August (which is the day after the August Bank-holiday Monday, so anyone attending Southern Centres to avoid being charged, you will need to leave on the Monday. Malcolm also asked about the indemnity insurance and was told that once club is informed by the insurance company, they will inform centres what is covered, until then carry on as normal. **IT PROJECT MANAGER**: Unfortunately there seems to be a problem with the centre emails today. Bob has tried to contact the company, however they only respond to emails to their support desk and do not take calls.

**ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION:** Bob will take the photos to Nominations to choose an Event Book Cover. He will then hand Carole all of the photos for the AGM competitions. The Centre Competitions will be chosen at the next meeting, after the AGM. Chairman read his report and it was accepted by a show of hands. **AGM** Carole said the Youth AGM will be in the main hall. Sandy and Bob will purchase desserts.

Letter from FM Tags informing us that their prices will increase in 2023. There was an enquiry via the website from Clint the DJ, enquiring if he

could be of service to us again, his fee for New Year would be £750. VICE: email from FM Tags. Has been in contact with Clint and will keep him on the books.

**REPORTS:** CHAIRMAN: Thanked everyone for their work over the New Year Event. He said everyone enjoyed themselves. Bob conveyed his condolences to Sue Jones on the loss of her mum.

**TREASURER**: There is £6935.03 in the current account. The deposit account has accrued £87.34 interest making a total of £7032.71. Youth account £415.20. **RALLY SECRETARY**: has been looking into a programme for 2024. Has sent the committee out a sheet with ideas on for sites to visit. Has had some response back with some ideas which can pursued. Had a response from Townings Farm and still waiting for the T&C from Laughing Fish for confirmation of pricing. The 6 Bells confirmed that we could not go there this year, as there is hay growing in the field at that time. Bob has booked Berwick Parish Field to replace this venue. Has contacted Sharnfold Farm but was told that the new owners said it would be £15 per night, per unit, this would be far too expensive for a weekend or even a Bank-Holiday

**ITEMS FOR DISSCUSSION :** Refunds for New Year – discussed in full. Each case was taken individually but only 2 had given sufficient advanced warning of cancellation. All the others had cancelled once the rally had commenced or left before the end. Carole is to write and inform individuals.

**PAST EVENTS** Christmas Party – a super event that everyone enjoyed. Bob noted that Willingdon had stepped in with a venue at the last minute. New Year – the practice night band were excellent but the disco at New Year was unfortunately very bad.
